

Ligonier Township Supervisors
Regular Meeting
January 24, 2017

The Ligonier Township Supervisors met in regular session at 4:30 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance opening the meeting. Secretary Bruce Robinson took roll call. Present were D. Scott Matson; Bruce Robinson; Gary Thistlethwaite; Chairman, Wade Thomas; and Vice Chairman, Paul Knupp.

- A motion was made by Scott Matson and seconded by Gary Thistlethwaite to suspend rules of the meeting due to time constraints, to go out of order of the meeting. Motion carried

Supervisor Comments

1. **Bruce Robinson**- Addressed the issues with LTMA and there is 1.1 million in bank with LTMA. Line break at reservoir and needs replaced and would eat up the funds to do so, 537 Plan update. Extend to Fairfield water line-debt off the books this is not legal and not right. Malfunctioning lines in Oakgrove. There are no grants out there to get, just debt.
2. **Paul Knupp**- Bruce covered it. Echo Bruce's statements
3. **Wade Thomas**- Feels it would be beneficial at this time to render an explanation into the possible sale of the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority. The Board of Supervisors has proven to the citizens of Ligonier Township that over the last few years they have insured the township has operated in a professional and fiscally reasonable matter, they even voted to lower the taxes from five to four mills this year. We will continue to strive to find ways to operate in this manner. One issue that arose several months ago was the possibility of selling Ligonier Township Municipal Authority. As any reasonable local government agency would do, they looked at these possibilities, had numerous conversations regarding what is best for the citizens of the township. With any large issue that would affect a large portion of the population a lot of information was bannered about some was true and some false. The Board of Supervisors will continually strive to make the best decisions they can to benefit the citizens of the township, some decisions are easy and some are much more difficult. It is their responsibility to look at these possibilities, render these decisions and the number one priority and number one question they ask themselves is, "Does this benefit the citizens of Ligonier Township?" He hopes that everyone can see the progress accomplished over the last few years, How far they have come as a government entity from the days when the township was front-page news for all the wrong reasons. They look forward to working with Ligonier Township Municipal Authority in the future in doing what is best for the township.

Public Comment

- John Beaufort** – In the past couple of years the Ligonier Township Board of Supervisors expressed an interest in selling the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority to another entity. This meeting the Board of Supervisors are considering voting to dissolve the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority, this is well within their jurisdiction of the Ligonier Township Board of Supervisors and Ligonier Township Municipal Authorities Board will respect that if that is the Ligonier Township Board of Supervisors decision. As a representative of Ligonier Township Municipal Authority, I first want to express Ligonier Township Municipal Authorities disagreement on any decision to sale the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority and they have the points. We recognize in the past the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority has not raised the rates and possibly set aside money for long-term goals of Ligonier Township Municipal Authority. To ligate for not setting the money aside the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority Board tried to keep the rates as low as possible and still run the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority to keep the rates as low as possible for the citizens of Ligonier Township. Ligonier Township Municipal Authority Board also state the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority is a valuable and an income producing entity with more than a million one hundred some thousand dollars at hand at this time and I will go into that a little later. We also want to recognize while the expansion of the sewer system has been slow Ligonier Township Municipal Authority have completed projects within the last 10-15 years. Ligonier Township Municipal Authority expand the sewer system for example the Darlington area with the Darlington sewage plant and Laughlintown area. As for the water, Ligonier Township Municipal Authority has reworked the filtration system, dredge the reservoir, and replaced and added water lines down Red Rock and Darlington area, all done in the last four years to amount to about eight million dollars spent. Ligonier Township Municipal Authority also want to present to the Ligonier Township Board of Supervisors, citizens of Ligonier Township, and media a business plan for the future of Ligonier Township Municipal Authority (attached). The plan takes into account future expansion, future inter structure needs, management needs, and future possibility of business opportunities. Ligonier Township Municipal Authority Boards feels that the plan and the help the Ligonier Township Board of Supervisors can produce the expansion needed. Ligonier Township Municipal Authority Board can manage the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority in a professional manner a create business opportunities and expansion opportunities to insure the viability of Ligonier Township Municipal Authority is here for many years in the future. Some of the goals, to hire a manager as talk has been going on for the past three years since Paul has left, and want that done immediately. The Authority Board wants to and have been working with the Ligonier Township Board of Supervisors on the Act 537 and moving forward with the Oakgrove sewer system. Ligonier Township Municipal Authority have the designs done and submitted to the state for their review and it kicked back, because of the questions, “Are we going be there or not?” Raise the rate-definitely the need to raise the rates eventually and would like to do over the course of two to three years are not about to raise them twenty-five or thirty percent immediately. Talk of putting an inter structure fund setup, Latrobe Municipal Authority has that setup and they a six dollar a quarter bill to set aside for replacing inter structures. Need to hire a full-time secretary, also have and would want to keep developing a research grant for Waterford/Wilpen expansion. Talked about and has been an on-going thing, brought up through the citizens, to research business opportunities, expansion opportunities, replacement of existing lines-Authority Board does and have discussed about replacing lines and working with the Ligonier Township Board of Supervisors now for grants from the county for a line down by Idlewild. Working with The EADS Group the township water engineer in replacing water meters, if there are grants out there for that to do in the Waterford area. The business plan considers any historical oversights and address any future expansion and business opportunity. What is does not take into consideration is the great possibilities of federal monies granted for the inter structure projects. The new administration has been quite clear of one of the priorities is fund and upgrade roads bridges, airports, water lines and sewer line. Possible maybe, but we cannot and would not integrate into the business plan; we certainly think that needs to be mentioned. Some of the grants the Authority got when doing Darlington was through the Obama era when they started giving grants out and that keeps the rates low.

Could we go out and finance the project down through Oakgrove, the Authority has talked bonding and the Authority could do that, but the citizens the rates are going to have to be raised and citizens are not going to be able to afford it. Therefore, that is why you work for grants and try to keep the rates as low as possible. Does it happen overnight? No, it does not. We have demonstrated that in the past, we are a viable and an income producing entity and with this business plan, we want to demonstrate that we wish to continue and to be a viable income producing entity. However, we cannot accomplish this without the support and assistants of the Ligonier Township Board of Supervisors. Ligonier Township historically has some of the best water in the Commonwealth if not the entire country, Ligonier Township Municipal Authority have been told that by some of the people bidding on the water. We continue to offer our customers, the citizens of Ligonier Township a great product at a reasonable price. After raising the rates, that product will continue to be a reasonable and high quality. Also should mention a great service, but not least in this level of service a local authority to provide our citizens. In Youngwood, Unity Township and many other communities throughout Westmoreland County, no longer can they travel to discuss their water and sewage issues with local authorities; they must travel or telephone New Stanton. In closing, what we have has slowly been disappearing from the country a locally own Municipal Authority, are there issues that come with that, Yes. Do the pros outweigh the cons, absolutely? I respect that Ligonier Township Board of Supervisors consider this plan and give the Ligonier Township Municipal the opportunity to work alongside them and continue to bring great service and great quality of product to the citizens. Ligonier Township Municipal Authority can accomplish this if we work together. Thank you for your time. One of thing, I think we need to address, and that is Bruce and Paul's comments. The comments that the water line coming down from the reservoir needs to be replaced, possibly. There is great debate whether it needs to be replaced; has it broke, absolutely. Ligonier Township Municipal Authority have talked to other engineer firms and municipalities and we believe that we do not have any more breaks than other municipalities do for the amount of lines that Ligonier Township Municipal Authority has in Ligonier Township. Ligonier Township Municipality Authority has looked at replacing that line when Paul was Manager; Paul came to us and said, "I want to replace that line". It was asked while Paul was the manager, what will it cost Paul? Paul had no idea what it would cost. The Authority went out and got the cost and that is the million dollars that Bruce brought up. Are we going to replace that line? Not sure and the engineers are not sure that it really does need to be replaced. Are there other lines in the Township we looked at? Absolutely. There are other lines and we know where those lines are, we talked to our engineer, are working on that, and have worked on in the past. The money that you are saying to put this line up through what you are doing with the Municipal Authority of Westmoreland County, their giving you so much money and giving it back to them, so what are you getting from the Municipal Authority of Westmoreland County? It really is not the money it is the service and the control of the Municipal Authority it is the people. A lot of what Bruce said is true, but a lot is not.

2. **Paul Hefner** – Supervisors made a good investment in Mr. Falatovich, he and Mr. Carcella are independent contractors. Supervisors are supposed to be caretakers of the township, but the fire sell mentality at the end of the day, is it about water or future economic development? Water is the foremost issue and we have the most pristine. Does not want inferior Johnstown water.
3. **Randy Mollomo** – Has there been a valuation done? As well as a separate independent valuation? If so, will you share that information with the citizens this evening? If not, why would you abolish the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority without knowing its true value? If valuation have not been done, I suggest to at least tabling the vote to abolish the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority until you have time to do your do diligent. Mr. Falatovich answered the question that a valuation has not been done.
4. **Don Kissell**- Lifelong resident of the township and would like to thank Mr. Beaufort for doing is do diligent. We have some of the purest water around. If Coors Light market and profit from the water why can't the township? Protect what you do have.

5. **Stephanie Vern-** Do appreciate some of the facts and information you guys shared at the beginning of the meeting. Feel it would be super helpful if that information could be issued in a more formal manner ahead of the meetings. Is a CPA and CFO of a company, very educated people here within the township? Fact and Appearance, Conflict of Interest at least in appearance. Sounds like a large conglomerate. Would rather have quality services and good quality of life then have taxes lowered.
6. **Annie McDougal-** Thank you for the Comprehensive Plan meeting. Topics touched on were firefighters, tourism, public safety, and community and business development. EADS said the LTMA was a work in progress. Very frustrated with the Supervisors lack of communication. Would like to start a dialog with the Supervisors. The LTMA Board has done a fantastic job running the LTMA for the past 22 years. Mr. Robinson should not vote on this as he has close connections with MAWC and will you rejoin the MAWC board since your recent removal once this is all done?
7. **Ed Oles** – Main interest is the quality of the water his family uses. LTMA clearly has their data on their website; however, MAWC had no data on their website. Johnstown water contains fluoride and the township water does not. Ninety percent less contaminates in the township water than Johnstown water. Want to keep our water.
8. **Patty Ostosky** – comprehensive plan a great response. Water is need for any new endeavors to succeed, so why would you want to sell the best water around. There is the possibility of grants and changes coming with the new Trump administration. Please do not sale the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority and get the Ligonier Township comprehensive plan right.
9. **Don Carey** – Appreciate the work the supervisors do. This is a serious subject and agree with the speakers before him. Nothing yet really cuts the mustard yet with the information provided. Please do not sale the Authority.
10. **Vickie Oles** – Would be good to have a report from the information given at the beginning of the meeting and is satisfied with the water quality and service of the LTMA. Gas drilling and fracking with drinking water quality
11. **Dave Kromel** – Public has been held in the dark. Talked to Paul and he said trust me. If such a good plan why is LTMA against it? Eight million dollar shortfall. When you played monopoly what did you not sale-Utilities. Big issues here, do not sale the water.
12. **Ron Nordstrom** – Couple issues related and comprehensive survey that was done, the number one concern was to keep to preserve the beauty, charm, integrate, and natural environment Ligonier and Ligonier Township, clean Laurel Mountain water is one of these. Danger of fracking.
13. **Rosalyn Robitale** – Agree with all the speakers tonight that LTMA should not be sold or transferred to the supervisors. Hope you provide more information
14. **Collen Raymen** – Live on a farm in the township with a well and septic system and MAWC one of the potential buyers could force us to tap into the sewer system and have to pay thousands of dollars for a service we do not want or need. Interested in being forced to pay for an inferior product, as we believe there is a substantial difference in quality between our Ligonier spring water and something like Johnstown city water.

15. **Nate Johnason** – Here as a citizen and business owner. Bread making of his business needs water and the quality of what in the township prevented the purchase of a water purifier that saved money. Suggestion to put in a bypass? Un-American to force people to pay for tap ins. State of execution.
16. **Kathleen Platt** – Very happy to be here, but quite disappointed that it took six months have a public meeting. Has cousin in Pittsburgh that works for their water authority and he told me that Ligonier Valley has the best water in Pennsylvania. Would like to go along with everyone else to keep the water.

Gary Falatovich spoke and provided some information and bullet points to the public. He apologized that the information did not get out prior to the meeting. The valuation as to the ordinance there is nothing about the sale of LTMA. The problem with a valuation being performed is that the Ligonier Township Board of Supervisor do not own LTMA. The only thing the supervisors can do is appoint members to the board and vote to dissolve the authority. All of your points are well taken. Read the ordinance that is in place there is nothing on a sale. There are questions on what the LTMA Board can do what they intend in a timely manner.

- A motion was made by Paul Knupp and seconded by Scott Matson to approve generally tabling Ordinance 4-2017 the abolishment of the Ligonier Township Municipal Authority. Motion carried with a 4-1 vote, Bruce Robinson voting Nay
- A motion was made by Gary Thistlethwaite and seconded by Paul Knupp to approve the minutes of the December 13, 2016 meeting and January 3, 2017 Re-organization meeting. Motion carried

Manager's Report – Terry Carcella reported that we collected \$20,054.00 and \$2,110.00 not collected on the Hydrant Fees and on the Street Lights a \$908.00 not collected. If resolution is approved tonight, 161 notices will be sent out to the customers in the rears. Recreation re-organization they reorganized and talked about working on the Wilpen playground still funds available from grant and the possibility of taking over the Laughlinton playground. Dirt and Fill Policy and new policy has been completed and all citizens that are on the list will be provided with the new policy and application to be completed if they are still interested.
