# Ligonier Township Supervisors Regular Meeting Minutes

June 13, 2023

The Supervisors of Ligonier Township met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. Present were Vice Chair, Erik Ross; Secretary/Treasurer, Stephanie Verna; Supervisor, D. Scott Matson; and Supervisor, John Beaufort. Chairman Dan Resenic was absent.

Also present were Manager, Michael Strelic; Solicitor, Dan Hudock; Engineer, Ben Faas; Chief of Police, Michael Matrunics; and Finance Officer, Bethany Caldwell.

# **Comments from the Supervisors**

Supervisor Beaufort – Reported there were approximately 82 calls total among the three departments:

Station 42 – 23 calls (Darlington) – 1 structure fire

Station 44 – 23 calls (Waterford)

Station 45 – 24 calls (Wilpen)

Most calls were for automatic fire alarms. These false alarms cost money. The annual fundraising letter is going out soon – be on the lookout. There is a fire drill at the Waterford Station tomorrow night, they are going to smoke out a trailer and it is open to the community.

#### **New Business**

 A motion was made by Scott Matson and seconded by John Beaufort approving the Fort Ligonier Day's detour. Motion carried.

### Ligonier Beach Study Steering Committee

There was a discussion about the Ligonier Beach steering committee – the manager asked for clarity: how many members should be appointed to the committee? Board representation?

Supervisor Matson thinks it should be limited to seven or five members.

Supervisor Beaufort thinks it is important that the supervisor that is appointed to the committee be open to the many possibilities.

Mr. Strelic clarified that he didn't need an answer now as we are still waiting for the DCNR contract.

Supervisor Verna said we should be thinking about these items now, because the process will take longer as these things can only be decided in a board meeting.

Mr. Hudock recapped the DCNR's guidance on who should be on this committee – people from the watershed, conservancy, school district, etc. and representatives from different age groups.

Supervisor Verna said if we're putting a call out to the community, we need to define what it is we're looking for – the number of volunteers, the type of volunteers, the time commitment, what will they be responsible for...

Melissa Eller recapped some of the discussion ideas from their meeting with DCNR – having a representative from Go Laurel Highlands / the tourism industry, someone from LVSD, from the Chamber. One thought was sending letters to these organizations.

Supervisor Verna directed staff to find out, "What is the objective of the committee? What is their authority?" We need this information to help us make a decision. Can FOLB / Mike Strelic make a recommendation of the persona we are looking for at the next meeting.

Terrell Funk suggested that someone from the Recreation Board be appointed to the committee since the project will probably be turned over to them to manage at some point. Supervisor Verna said the Rec Board is still welcome to participate in this process.

No action was taken, and the matter was deferred to the next meeting.

# Friends of Ligonier Beach July kickoff event

The Friends of Ligonier Beach would like to hold some type of event at the Ligonier Beach property, but since the Board took action to close the property, it will need to take action to reopen it. This is a joint event between the Township, FOLB, and would engage the public, generate interest in the property, and facilitate discussion about the

possibilities for the property. Would like to have the Supervisors kick it off, it's a good opportunity to educate the public.

Concerns are insurance – in the past we required event organizers to obtain a policy and waivers were signed to release the Township from liability. With the buildings being torn down are there safety issues? Could we fence off hazardous areas? Directed Manager to check in with our insurance and ensure we are adequately protected and minimize exposure. FOLB to come back with a more concrete idea.

Terrell Funk – had concerns there were people skateboarding in the empty pool.


