Ligonier Township Police Department

Despite recent controversy over the signage of properties and residences, I would like to encourage all residents to properly mark their homes and/or their lanes.

This is not intended to be an invasion of our residents' personal information and privacy, but merely to better assist emergency responders in what could possibly be a critical situation where time is essential.

Ligonier Township Supervisors recently tabled the signage ordinance. However, this decision does not preclude private residents from taking the initiative to properly mark their homes. If your home is located at the end of a private lane or driveway, please mark the end of that driveway so that, should an emergency arise, we are able to find you as quickly as possible.

I have been continuously answering calls in Ligonier Township where lanes and houses are still not marked. One particular incident was an ambulance call where the patient was in critical condition, unconscious. All three emergency agencies: the police, ambulance and fire department had difficulty finding the exact house because the residence had not been marked. This was very frustrating for the responders and they all wished that the house had been marked.

In recent months all emergency services wrote the township supervisors a letter of concern expressing the issue of the lack of house markings. One concern for the supervisors is that they do not want to fine township residents for such an offense. In reality it is unlikely that without the threat of penalty, individuals will not comply. For example: speed limit signs. We all talk about police enforcing the speeding laws. When you see a police car along the road what is your first initial feeling? You probably hit the brakes if you were speeding. You also probably got a sick feeling in your stomach and looked into your rearview mirror to see if the lights were activated. My point is, if there were no consequences people would continue speeding and this is now a safety issue. It is not our intent to fine home owners, but think of the consequence if your house is not marked and emergency services could not find your house.

Please comply with the request from your emergency services and mark your homes and driveways - it may mean the difference between life and death.

Rails to Trails

It has been brought to our attention that the recent completion of the Rails to Trails Bridge has enticed youth to jump from the bridge railing into Millcreek. This is not only dangerous but may be considered disorderly conduct and a punishable offense. Any actors caught jumping from the bridge railing into Millcreek shall be cited and prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law. We urge parents and trail users to remind their youth that this is dangerous and we hope that everyone will take a proactive approach to prevent this from happening.

TAX COLLECTOR

Ligonier Township fall property taxes (school) will be mailed August 1, 2013. If you do not receive a tax statement, please contact the tax office. Failure to receive a tax statement does not relieve the taxpayer of the responsibility of payment. Tax statements are no longer mailed to the mortgage companies for payment. Taxpayers are responsible for sending the tax statement to the mortgage companies. The last day to pay your 1st school installment payment is September 30; last day to pay your 2nd installment payment October 30; the last day to pay your 3rd installment payment November 30. If you pay after these dates on your installment payment there will be a 10% penalty added. The last day to pay school taxes (fall) at discount is September 30, 2013. If paying by mail or through the door slot, make sure to enclose the statement and a self-addressed stamped envelope with the payment if you wish to receive a receipt. Ligonier Township spring taxes (county and township) are at penalty until December 31, 2013. An after hour, drop-off slot is available at the tax collectors office to accept payments before or after normal business hours.



Not everyone will receive a letter at the same time. Installation instructions will be supplied when the tap in fee is paid.
